I. Introductions

- The committee members and resource members introduced themselves and welcomed the new SSSP/Student Equity Research Analyst, Megan Sirna.
 - i. Research requests should be made through the SRS system
- II. Update on 2014-2015 Equity Plan
 - a. Expenses will need to be reported to the state in January
- III. Update on 2015-2016 Equity Plan
 - a. The Student Equity Plan will be presented to the Board of Trustees on Nov. 24 and Board approval is expected at the Dec. 8 meeting
 - b. There was some discussion about some concerns that were raised at the Faculty Senate meeting regarding the Career Success Center proposal.
 - i. Mark, Doug Benoit (Dean of Business/CIS), Lisa Campbell (Dean of Counseling), Deb, and Mary met to discuss 1) clarifying the proposal to include only activities funded by equity, 2) changing the name to avoid confusion with the Career and Life Planning Center, and 3) continuing to ensure collaboration between student services and instructional services.
 - c. After the plan is approved by the Board, it will be posted to the J:drive and the Student Equity website. The executive summary will be shared with the committee
 - d. The funding allocation the district and Fullerton College received was discussed to clarify any questions from committee members who missed the previous meeting (the district received less than anticipated because Foster Youth numbers were not reported).
 - i. The campus will support any additional costs that were approved from proposals that exceed the amount we received from the state.

IV. Planning for spring

- a. There was discussion about equity funding and projects for 2016-2017. Ideas included
 - Continuing to plan for coordination of similar activities (campus tours and tutoring, for example) with a possibility of having some larger themes for projects.
 - ii. Project coordinators will be contacted in the spring to provide an anecdotal evaluation of the project and determine if they will use all the funds allocated.
 - iii. How to continue to coordinate with Basic Skills and SSSP. The Basic Skills Committee shared at their meeting that they will be doing planning in mid-spring after receiving some data from the Office of Institutional Research and Planning.
 - iv. Individuals running current projects being able to resubmit their proposals to allow for changes that may have taken place over the previous year
 - v. Some projects naturally need longer timelines to see results and others may not want to continue so those things will need to be taken into consideration
 - vi. It might be good to give others on campus an opportunity to submit a proposal for a project idea that would meet equity goals
 - vii. It's important to look more closely at where the largest needs are and base funding on that
 - viii. It may be necessary to be involved with conversations about larger campus projects such as the building projects if space is a concern for some current programs
