Proposal Name	Proposed Activities
Academic Role Boosting: Decreasing Men of Color Achievement Gap	Audio/visual media related to academic role identity, etc., High touch interaction through remind app, peer interaction/modeling sessions, two social interaction sessions with role models
Behavioral Intervention Team Student Equity Project	Hire a full-time BIT Case Manager to provide resources and support to a group of particularly at-risk students
DSS	DSS presentations at HS, One-on-one specialized assistance in Math, English, and reading, small group assistance sessions
Educators for Equity	Train adjunct faculty in equity-minded practices supported through teachings on Teaching Men of Color and diversity
EOPS	Adjunct counselors to provide counseling appts (required for EOPS students) and Academic Progress Report monitoring; hourly support to support office, Textbook award (increase from what EOPS provides); purchase textbooks, calculators, and laptops for lending library; MyMathLab codes (can't be purchased with EOPS funds); school supplies, above and beyond tutoring, Speakers and workshops on equitable practices
Ethnic studies cultural programming	Cultural programming: Day of the Dead, Social Justice summit, Kwanzaa Celebration, East LA walkout event, Native Am dance group, speaker series, African-American Cultural studies events, collaborate with VRC to attend WW2 mural
FC Miles	FC Miles ALEKS Labs (adaptive math skills software), Math department faculty workshops and individual meetings with students to discuss course advancement, tutoring/peer mentoring
Financial Aid	Financial Aid Technician ((assist students appealing disqualified status, assist AB540 students on application, act as homeless liaison, increase financial literacy/wellness, provide training to other FA counselors on resources, assist students from equity programs with impact of equity resources on financial aid, act as a point person for students from equity-funded programs)
Foster Youth Success Initiative Program	Tutor/peer mentor for basic skills math and English, Direct support to students through meal cards, hotel vouchers, school supplies, campus fees not covered by BOG, print accounts, tablet loan program, textbook award, assist with required course materials, transportation assistance (bus passes or gas cards), childcare, Mental Health counselor (Prof Expert), conferences, workshops, staff development/training Adjunct counselors to provide counseling appts (required for EOPS students) and Academic Progress Report monitoring; hourly support to support office, Outreach, orientation, campus tours
Grads to Be	Psychosocial counseling and Academic Counseling (no cost--covered by interns and SSSP, Education and training: Parent information sessions, Undocumented student conference (FC coordinates and hosts), staff development trainings (led by Grads to be staff), speaker series, conference attendance, outreach, Mentoring following a case management model (initial assessment, regular sessions, referrals, follow-up), Psycho-educational groups
Health Services	Hire 1.5 mental health prof experts to restore access to mental health professionals to previous level; provide individual counseling sessions, Provide student support groups covering various mental health, coping, and life skills issues, Increase education about mental health services and strengthen the community health network referral
Honors	Support student presentations at conferences with a focus on supporting DI students to present
Incite	Study hall with designated space and tutors; educational supplies for students; Health related Title IX workshops; student recognition events
MAS	MAS conference includes information related to programs and services on and off campus to ease transition by allowing students to explore campus, interact with college representatives and other incoming students
Office of Student Equity	Provide support for individuals administering student equity funded programs with clerical and logistical needs, Provide student support groups related to student equity program development, planning, and implementation. Hospitality and PE/overtime pay may be used to pay for additional hours worked by faculty or classified, Travel to regional and state equity focused conferences, trainings, and meetings. Host Region 8 Equity group meeting. Host equity-focused speakers.

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Puente	Northern CA UC campus tour with presentation from former Puente students, admissions staff, campus administrator, and campus tour, End of year banquet to recognize academic accomplishments (for students, coordinators, mentors, and families), Pre-semester retreat for incoming Puente students, Welcome dinner for students and parents, Student/mentor dinner, training for mentors, embedded English and Math tutoring
SDSI	Life Skills Coaching: work on identifying academic, professional, and personal goals, counseling, University/Ambassador mentoring--assist with orientation, scheduling appts, office duties as well as peer mentoring; Outreach focused on classroom and high school events, Book loan program and other educational supplies, laptop loan program
Staff Development	Equity-theme flex day activities and adjunct academy, Equity-minded focused inquiry group, Support conference attendance to equity-focused conferences (such as NCORE); host equity related workshops/presentations by conference attendees as part of required dissemination plan, Support faculty and staff to participate in the Teaching/Supporting Men of Color online certificate
Student Leadership Development Program	Student leadership retreat at UCI (including supplies and materials, stipends to faculty/staff facilitators, and prof expert to coordinate), Student leadership co-curricular certificate (including supplies and materials, stipends to faculty/staff facilitators, and prof expert to coordinate)
Student Services Specialist Athletics	Conduct a needs assessment to understand social-emotional needs of student athletes; Connect students to on and off campus services, Full-time life coach to provide referrals, support, and direction to student athletes with a focus on at-risk student athletes
Summer Bridge	Summer Bridge Program: 4 day event to assist incoming students with transition to FC. Students will gain awareness through presentations and access to current students
Transfer Center Equity Projects	Transfer Ambassador program: provide on campus tabling, signing students up for transfer events, short presentations, sharing transfer experience, Evening and weekend service/hours: provide counseling and classified hours 4 Saturdays during the fall semester, Out of area university tours: Continue offering 2-3 day tour which includes opportunity to meet FC alumni who have transferred
Umoja Community Program	Umoja Learning Community: provide linked Ethnic studies and counseling courses; Umoja Summer Transitional Education Program--provides orientation to Umoja and learning community, Umoja comprehensive case management model: ensure counseling appts are made, ed plans are created and reviewed, and students are connected to campus resources. Activities supported by Umoja Student Learning and Development position (graduate student), Math/Writing tutoring; Mshauri (mentoring) program, workshops, textbook lending library, conference Attendance (including state Umoja conference, regional symposium, A2MEND); Cultural excursions, kwanzaa, University tours, on-campus collaborations (athletic department, Cadena center, SDSI, and Incite)
Veterans Resource Center Project	Math and English Tutoring, Academic and Resource Success Library (academic materials, calculators, hard-copy books), Orientation, Adjunct counselor to increase counseling capacity and case management (includes academic and personal, mental health, and employment support), Professional development to increase programs and services offered to veterans, End of year recognition event
